Three main subthemes:

1. Accelerating energy efficiency and the transition to renewable energy

– a "Pacific New Energy Drive"

- 2. Ensuring climate-resilient sustainable development: climate-proofing key infrastructure & adapting key industries
- 3. Address longer-term threats to security, including island inhabitability, forced relocation and loss of territory

"Majuro Declaration for Climate Leadership"

- Stand-alone: Pacific-driven/owned, globally relevant
- Recognize at "fork in the road": need big lift in pre-2020 ambition; transition to clean energy & low-carbon development – stepping stone to UNSG 2014 Summit; Global SIDS Conference; 2015 LBA
- Demonstrate Pacific leadership, particularly on RE (Pacific Energy Summit → "Pacific New Energy Drive")
- Once adopted:
 - Call on Post-Forum Dialogue Partners to support
 - Call on all Governments and other stakeholders (business, cities, civil society, individuals) to contribute with "new and additional" ambition.
 - Deliver as "Pacific Gift" to UNGA 2013 → 2014 Summit



"Majuro Declaration for Climate Leadership"

- → How to prepare?
 - Leaders ready to list national mitigation plans / targets / actions (existing and/or new)
 - Could indicate intent to formulate as NAMA (note SPREP work on NAMA guidelines)
 - Indicate where support needed and bring written proposals for sharing with partners
