## Some daunting Pacific asks

### We need certainty;

• Size matters, everything is relative and small is beautiful;

#### We need choices;

- In context of entities to access GCF funding;
- We need simplified approval processes
  - Level of funding and approval should be evenly matched,

#### • You heard us, Adaptation is in our DNA

 Adaptation and mitigation are both sides of the same coin and should be treated equally;

### Don't tell us, Help us

We must be ready to stake our claim for our share of GCF resources when it is open for business. And please hear us.

## **GCF's Governing Instrument**

- Minimum floor of 50% of adaptation allocation particularly for vulnerable groups
- Access to GCF resources through National, Regional and International Implementing entities accredited by the GCF Board;
- Simplified approval process for certain activities, particularly small scale activities;
- Fund will aim for a 50-50 balance between mitigation and adaptation;
- Readiness & preparatory direct support of up to \$300000
   to help/support NDAs/Focal Points;

Country ownership is central pillar of the Funds operating principles

# The NDA – Point of Departure for engaging with the GCF

- All countries need to nominate a National Designated Authority or Focal Point
- Primary coordination point in the national government for all GCF activities
- All project proposals need the written approval by the NDA

# What Pacific needs to do to ensure that these innovation materialize on the ground?

- Be proactive in communicating with the GCF Secretariat
- Move quickly in identifying the institutions of choice for accessing the Fund
- Use accredited entities in the region while developing national capacities to benefit from the first round of project approvals
- Develop ambitious project proposals to utilize the minimum floor for SIDS, LDCs and Africa under the adaptation window
- Make strategic use of the Fund's readiness and preparatory support programme
